Weekly Report

Sunday, February 6, 2011

Last week I visited with the following legislators regarding all the bills that are in the system or I expect to be introduced before bill cutoff on Feb. 17. Representatives Gary Alexander, Brian Blake, Cathy Dahlquist, Joe Fitzgibbon, Jim Jacks, Kristine Lytton, Derek Stanford and Jason Overstreet. In the Senate I called on Senator Don Benton, Bob Morton, Jerome Devlin, Sharon Nelson and Scott White. All the conversations were regarding our positions on the bills that are of concern which are listed in this report. I spent a good deal of time visiting with legislators extending invitations to attend our dinner at the governor's mansion with Chris and first Mike. As of today I am short two seats at the event and expect to fill those tomorrow. Lee and I visited with the governor's lobbyist (Jim Justin) last week and reinforced our priority of leaving the LEOFF 2 system along. The March revenue forecast is due out in two weeks and if it is down even further there could be more pressure to look at additional funds from the various pension systems.

On Tuesday morning HB 1377 dealing with binding arbitration and HB 1550 (Pot Bill) will be heard in the morning and we strongly oppose both pieces of legislation and have officers testifying on both issues. On Wednesday HB 1282 (Moving WDFW officers into State Patrol) will be heard in the house and we will oppose the bill and participate in the hearing. There are a number of additional bills that I have added to our tracking list and if you have the time I would hope that you would look through the list and provide feedback regarding position and importance.
